Title 25 - Public Officers and Employees; Public Records

Chapter 3 - Salaries and Compensation General Provisions

§ 25-3-13. Salaries of supervisors

Universal Citation: MS Code § 25-3-13 (2019)

[Effective from and after January 1, 2020, this section will read as follows:]

(1) The salaries of the members of the boards of supervisors of the various counties are fixed as full compensation for their services.

The annual salary of each member of the board of supervisors shall be based upon the total assessed valuation of his respective county for the preceding taxable year in the following categories and for the following amounts:

(a) For counties having a total assessed valuation of less than Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), a salary of Twenty-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$29,870.00);

(b) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), but less than Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-three Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars (\$33,269.00);

(c) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), but less than Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-four Thousand Seven Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$34,711.00);

(d) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00), but less than One Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-one Dollars (\$35,741.00);

(e) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least One Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00), but less than Three Hundred Million Dollars (\$300,000,000.00), a salary of Forty-one Thousand Six Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$41,612.00);

(f) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Three Hundred Million Dollars (\$300,000,000.00), but less than One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Forty-one Dollars (\$46,041.00);

(g) For counties having a total assessed valuation of One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00), but less than Two Billion Dollars (\$2,000,000,000.00), a salary of Forty-seven Thousand Seventy-one Dollars (\$47,071.00);

(h) For counties having a total assessed valuation of Two Billion Dollars (\$2,000,000,000.00) or more, a salary of Forty-eight Thousand One Hundred One Dollars (\$48,101.00).

(2) The annual salary established for the members of the board of supervisors shall not be reduced as a result of a reduction in total assessed valuation.

(3) The salary of the members of the board of supervisors shall not be increased under this section until the board of supervisors shall have passed a resolution stating the amount of the increase and spread it on its minutes.

2018 Mississippi Code

Title 25 - Public Officers and Employees; Public Records

Chapter 3 - Salaries and Compensation

General Provisions

§ 25-3-13. Salaries of supervisors.

Universal Citation: MS Code § 25-3-13 (2018)

(1) The salaries of the members of the boards of supervisors of the various counties are fixed as full compensation for their services.

The annual salary of each member of the board of supervisors shall be based upon the total assessed valuation of his respective county for the preceding taxable year in the following categories and for the following amounts:

- (a) For counties having a total assessed valuation of less than Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), a salary of Twenty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$29,000.00);
- (b) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), but less than Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$32,300.00);
- (c) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), but less than Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$33,700.00);
- (d) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00), but less than One Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00), a salary of Thirty-four Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$34,700.00);
- (e) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least One Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00), but less than Three Hundred Million Dollars (\$300,000,000.00), a salary of Forty Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$40,400.00);
- (f) For counties having a total assessed valuation of at least Three Hundred Million Dollars (\$300,000,000.00), but less than One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00), a salary of Forty-four Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$44,700.00);
- (g) For counties having a total assessed valuation of One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00), but less than Two Billion Dollars (\$2,000,000,000.00), a salary of Forty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$45,700.00);

(h) For counties having a total assessed valuation of Two Billion Dollars ⁰¹² (\$2,000,000,000.00) or more, a salary of Forty-six Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$46,700.00).

(2) The annual salary established for the members of the board of supervisors shall not be reduced as a result of a reduction in total assessed valuation.

(3) The salary of the members of the board of supervisors shall not be increased under this section until the board of supervisors shall have passed a resolution stating the amount of the increase and spread it on its minutes.

Whereas, Blood and platelets cannot be manufactured; they can only come from volunteer donors.; and

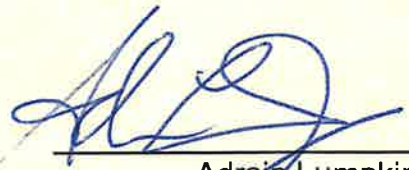
Whereas, Approximately 29,000 units of red blood cells are needed every day in the U. S.; and

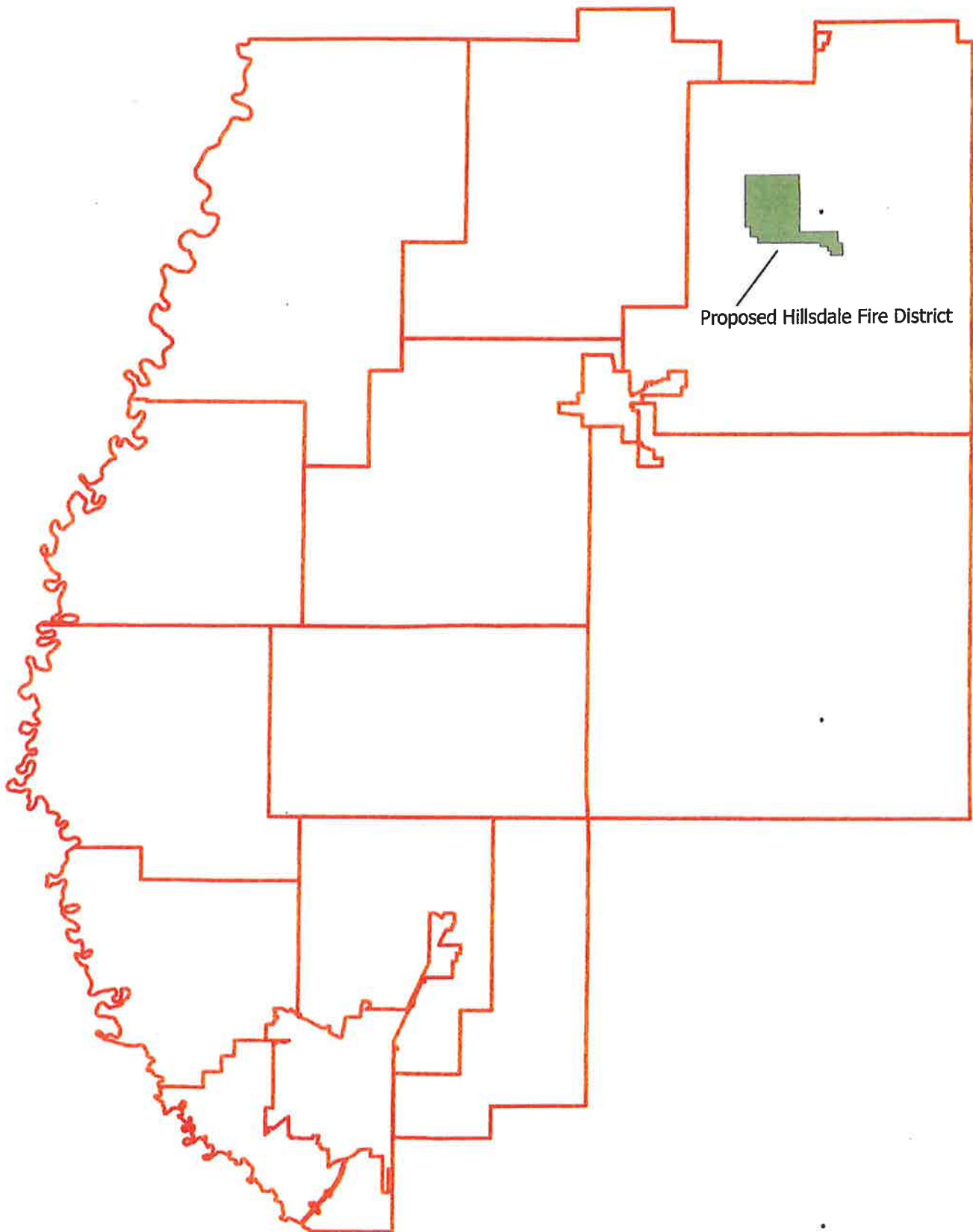

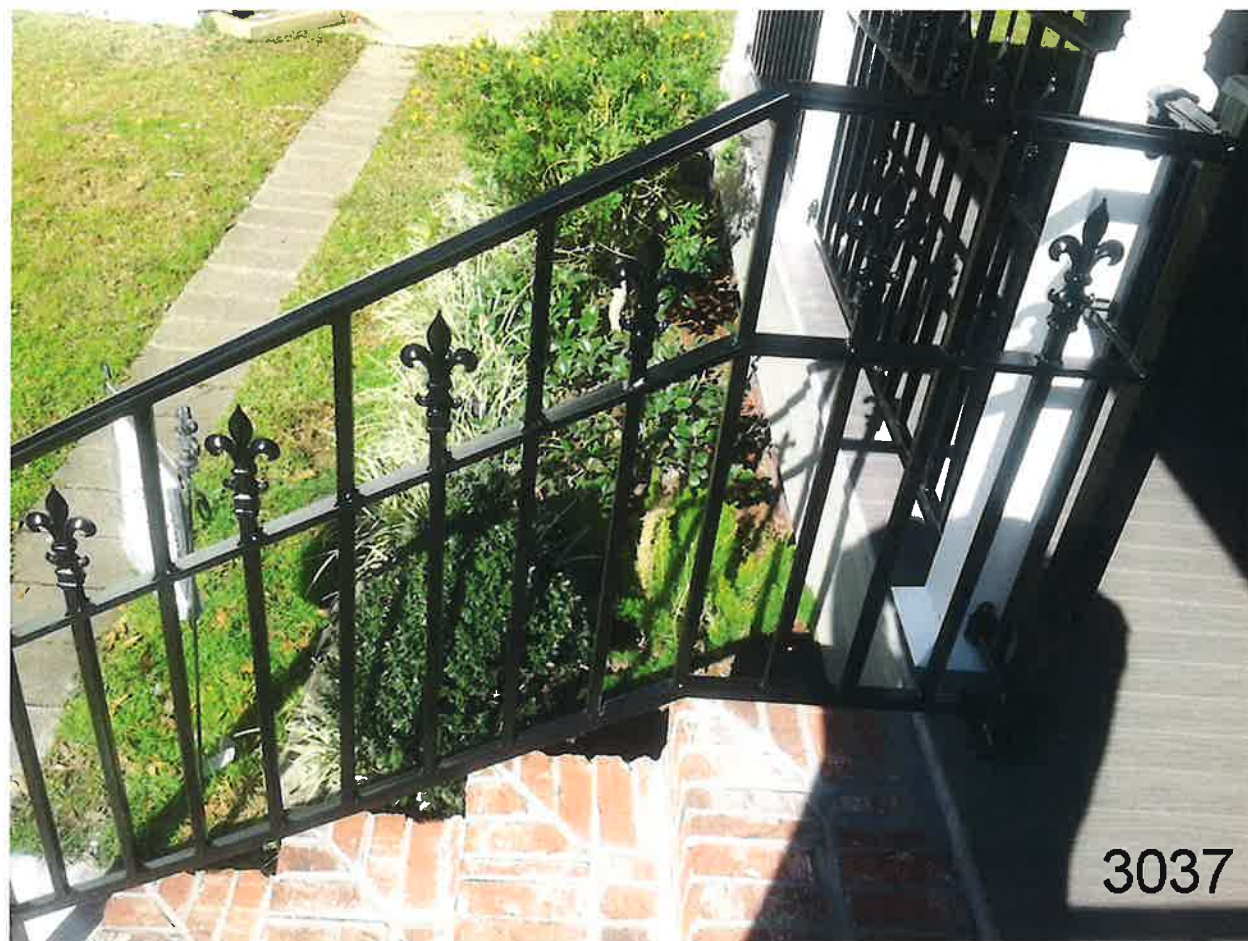

REPORT OF THE GRAND JURY

We, the Grand Jury of Pearl River County, Mississippi, for the regular July 2021 Term, submit the following report of work performed during this term of court, to-wit:

We, the Grand Jury was in session a total of 6 days and investigated 174 Matters, hearing testimony from 34 witnesses, touching on said matters. After carefully considering all of the testimony the Grand Jury returned a total of 152 true bills of indictment, containing 236 counts with respect to 163 individual defendants.

The report of the Chancery Clerk, ex-officio auditor, presented her report as required by law a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof marked Exhibit "A".

We have inspected public buildings and taken testimony from public officials concerning operation of the county and present the following findings and recommendations.

COURTHOUSE

Members of the grand jury have experience with routine inspections at their places of employment in Southern Mississippi and Louisiana. We made several observations of conditions that would not be acceptable at our place of employment because of:

OSHA Violations: These items will be highlighted as such and should be addressed to prevent injury to employees of the courthouse.

Employer Policies: We are all shaped by policies of our employers, and while these items may not be required by law, as the above items are, they should be considered best practices.

Historical Building Limitations: We heard loud and clear that the building is considered a historical structure, which results in some hurdles before some items can be addressed. For example, door knobs that are falling apart cannot be replaced with a new part from Home Depot.

Please keep in mind that if a faulty door knob has the potential to prevent proper means of egress during a fire, that would then become a serious liability.

Safety Items: Balcony area above courtroom: In some areas that wall was constructed at a lower level to allow viewing of the court. This is a violation of OSHA fall protection guidelines. A hand rail can be installed like you would see in any more recently built auditorium to prevent falls from heights. People working in the Public Defenders office are exposed to this hazard as they walk to their office.

2nd Floor File Room: There are multiple electrical boxes without covers, including a breaker box. These are OSHA violations along with the rules that discuss housekeeping in front of electrical panels. Trash, boxes and other clutter should not be on the floor blocking access to such items. There are several low voltage cable boxes in this area that are not of primary concern, although they do pose a significant housekeeping issue. There is little to no climate control. There is also a gas furnace in the file room that is a concern. IT equipment is being stored in the file room.

There is no hot water in public restrooms.

Peeling Paint in several areas. We were told that peeling paint through-out the courthouse has been tested and does not contain lead. This should be verified, especially in some of the less traveled areas like the old jail and basement.

Water bottle storage on stairs to old jail is a safety hazard. Stairways should be kept clear of clutter to prevent falls.

Main Stairs to Second Floor: Should there be a handrail on both sides of the stairs? We were not sure of the building code??

Sheriff's Office: There appears to be mold under the peeling paint. Has this been tested?

Third floor - wooden stairs on third floor as you exit elevator and walk towards Public Defenders office. Several jury members had concerns whether these steps posed a tripping hazard. The bathroom in the Public Defender's office has ceiling and wall damage.

Court room mezzanine has wood rot and termite damage.

Circuit Clerk's Office: As you walk towards the back there is a tripping hazard where the Carpet/Tile meet.

Jury members noticed use of extension cords that would not be acceptable at our places of employment. For example, the extension cord near the main entrance for the Dasani machine. Please review appropriate regulations.

Housekeeping Items:

Members of the jury work at local employers that would not accept poor housekeeping in the workplace. The list below contains a variety of issues, but it also contains workplace cultural issues that can be addressed by making better decisions.

Circuit Clerk's Office should be used as an example of what "Good" looks like. When you walk in, there is good lighting and no clutter. The main desk does not have unnecessary items laying around.

Examples of clutter and storage on floors:

Public Defenders office – boxes on floor.

2nd Floor File Room – total mess. Lots of boxes on floor along with other items.

Old Jail – Total mess. Boxes everywhere, no evidence of a filing system.

Sheriff's Office – storage room is a mess. No evidence of any system.

Main Entrance – paper signs taped to the door glass is not very professional way to convey information. The strips of cork board on each side are also poor. Items displayed on cork boards should fit within the boundaries of the cork board and not hang off.

Peeling paint in all areas. As mentioned above, we were told that this has been tested for lead, so we are considering it a housekeeping issue.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE CENTER

Opportunities For Improvements

Booking cell very unsanitary.

Holding cells need painting.

Shower stalls need cleaning.

Someone needs to be in the command tower at all times.

Equipment in the Main Control room needs updating.

Working tasers and pepper spray should be provided to the correctional officers.

Food looked and smelled bad.

Several return air grills need cleaning.

Canopy over sidewalk to “Yard” is damaged and needs repair/replace.

Need additional personnel.

Good Things

All walls and floors were very clean.

Safety Items

Sally Port – Open electrical box. Board under Pepsi machine sticks out creating a tripping hazard.

Visitation Room – Exposed wires on phones 1 and 4.

Law Library – Cords running across the floor are a tripping hazard.

Fire alarms and flashing lights through-out facility do not have labels showing the last date of inspection. Not sure if this is required in Mississippi as it is in other states.

Paper on cell windows should be replaced with mirror tint or some other form of security film so that the correction officers can see into the cells.

Old Control Room – Tower – Mops stored on the floor are a tripping hazard. Should be hung on a wall.

Housekeeping / Organizational Items

Duct tape on sign in lobby used to revise instructions.

Desk in Booking Area is damaged. Several areas where it is chipped or surface is broken.

Too many pieces of paper and hand written notes used everywhere, especially in booking area. No revision dates seen, so how do folks know if displayed information is current? Can all this information be stored on a web page???

Tissue paper stuck on ceiling of holding cell. Cleaning people need to look up when cleaning.

Main Control Room

- a. Computers just sitting on floor. A vertical PC rack would be a better method of holding them and look more professional.
- b. Big screws in end of desk to hold keys looks trashy.
- c. Broken glass window near door.

Visitation Area – black magic marker used to label phone stations. A more professional looking method of labeling could be used.

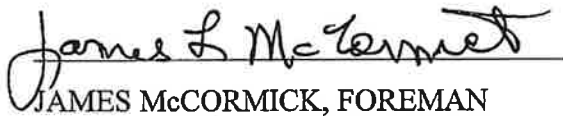
The storage room we passed in the hallway was very cluttered. No labels were seen on shelves indicating where items should be stored, along with how many items should be in each location.

Nurse Area was cluttered and had very little organization. Numerous cords and cables exposed and hanging into walkway. Would you feel comfortable receiving medical attention there?

Storing extra mats in hallway – dispose of damaged ones and make a proper storage location.

AND NOW, having completed our work, we respectfully request that we be discharged until and unless called back into session by your Honor, according to law.

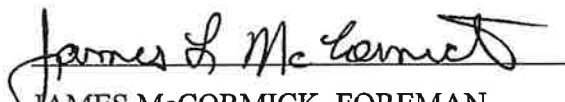

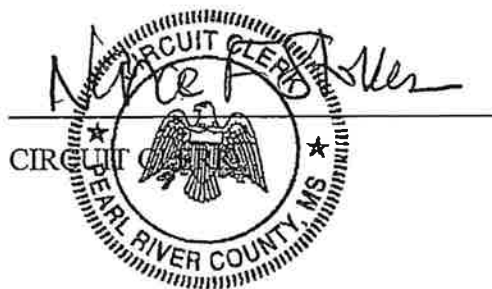

Tuition: \$1,500 (for full 200 hour Refresher course)

The 200 – hour course of instruction is available to:

1. Those officers who are required to attend the refresher course to renew or transfer their certification, who have had a break in service for more than 5 years or are from out of state.
2. Criminal Justice Professionals sponsored and screened (agency must attest to a background check) by a public or private institution in the criminal justice system or a closely related field.
3. Military personnel with a law enforcement MOS.

***New State Requirement for all attending the full 200 hour Refresher course:**

All refreshers attending the full 200 hour Refresher course, per the Board on Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Training **must complete and pass at 50% the Physical Fitness exam** administered by the training academy.

Anyone who falls into one of the above categories must obtain prior approval from the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards (BLEOST)

(1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, the following are declared to be legal holidays, viz: the first day of January (New Year's Day); the third Monday of January (Robert E. Lee's birthday and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday); the third Monday of February (Washington's birthday); the last Monday of April (Confederate Memorial Day); the last Monday of May (National Memorial Day and Jefferson Davis' birthday); the fourth day of July (Independence Day); the first Monday of September (Labor Day); the eleventh day of November (Armistice or Veterans' Day); the day fixed by proclamation by the Governor of Mississippi as a day of Thanksgiving, which shall be fixed to correspond to the date proclaimed by the President of the United States (Thanksgiving Day); and the twenty-fifth day of December (Christmas Day). In the event any holiday hereinbefore declared legal shall fall on Sunday, then the next following day shall be a legal holiday.

(2) In lieu of any one (1) legal holiday provided for in subsection (1) of this section, with the exception of the third Monday in January (Robert E. Lee's and Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday) and the eleventh day of November (Armistice or Veterans Day), the governing authorities of any municipality or county may declare, by order spread upon its minutes, Mardi Gras Day or any one (1) other day during the year, to be a legal holiday.

(3) August 16 is declared to be Elvis Aaron Presley Day in recognition and appreciation of Elvis Aaron Presley's many contributions, international recognition and the rich legacy left to us by Elvis Aaron Presley. This day shall be a day of recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal holiday.

(4) May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in recognition, observation and commemoration of Hernando de Soto, who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's 187-day journey from the Tombigbee River basin on our state's eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall be a day of commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and European exploration and shall not be recognized as a legal holiday.

(5) Armistice Day (Veterans Day) shall be observed by appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of Mississippi. The superintendent of schools of each public school district is authorized to provide for the appearance of uniformed military personnel, uniformed veterans or the families of fallen military personnel/veterans at such public school exercises in honor of Armistice (Veterans) Day. The superintendent of schools is also authorized to permit the school band and its director(s) at any public school in the district to perform at Armistice (Veterans) Day exercises in the school district upon the request of public officials or veterans associations without loss of any program credit by participating students and without loss of leave by participating school personnel.

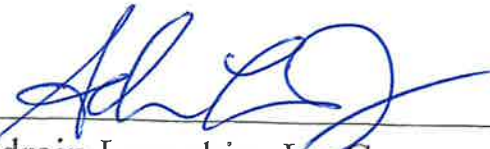
